

Summary

The survey results for County/Tribe Non-Medical PPE are currently being reviewed by the SEOC to determine allocation. DHS Operations is collecting questions regarding the Center for Medicaid and Medicare Services (CMS) such as questions about billing, waivers, etc. These questions will be sent through the HHS ASPR Liaison Officer to share with CMS, and CMS will be answering questions on a later webinar with the states. The SEOC remains elevated to a Level 1 activation and continues with 24 hour operations.

Governor Evers press releases and media briefings related to statewide mandates:

April 13, 2020

- Gov. Tony Evers today announced an application has been submitted to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to begin the development of a second alternative care facility (ACF) in Wisconsin to prepare for a potential surge in COVID-19 cases. The Army Corp of Engineers has partnered with states to build ACFs to support existing, local medical infrastructures in response to the spread of COVID-19.

- Participant hired providers caring for a COVID-19 positive patient in the patient’s home (Applies to all Medicaid Long Term Care programs).
- Adult Protective Services providers responding to a home with a COVID-19 positive person in their home.

Unmet Needs

The current unmet needs are being routed through Operations and some identified unmet needs have fallen to task forces, which include Isolation Facilities, Contact Tracing/Surveillance, Specimen Collection/Lab Capacity, Surge, Mortuary Planning, Data Analysis, Community Resilience, PPE & Essential Supplies, Logistics, Future Operations, and Staff Augmentation.

DHS	<p>DHS is collecting questions for the Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) regarding topics such as billing, waivers, etc. These questions will be collected at the state level and provided to CMS for them to answer on a future statewide call.</p> <p>DHS worked with DMA and PPE Logistics team members in order to lay the groundwork for integration of inventories of SNS and non-SNS resources.</p> <p>DHS continues to participate with the PPE Decontamination team, working with SMEs and additional staff to determine what options the state has in terms of supporting decontamination of N95 materials.</p>
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DATCP	<p>FTC, DATCP, BBB Webinar: Working Together to Protect Wisconsin Consumers from Covid-19-Related Scams. DATCP's Bureau of Consumer Protection is participating in an educational/informational webinar with the FTC and BBB of WI on Thursday, April 16, 2020 from 10:30 – 11:30 AM. The webinar will cover various COVID-19 related scams and things consumers should watch for to avoid scams and frauds during this time.</p>
DNR	<p>1. Wildfire Suppression: GREEN Current and projected fire staffing requirements are being met. Suppression capacity is diminished as a result of COVID with numerous staff having limited availability including our aeronautics staff. Fire danger varies from Low to Moderate today and the statewide fire preparedness remains at PL-2 today.</p> <p>2. Flood Response: GREEN Flood response staffing is at full capacity, including back-up staff. There are no known illnesses or absences among responders. All individuals are currently available to deploy as needed. Continuing to monitor flood conditions and forecasts. Some rivers continue to be at elevated levels, including the Mississippi River. Great Lakes water levels are still high.</p> <p>3. Law Enforcement/Asset Protection: YELLOW Continuing to assess staffing capacity/operations due to Parks properties and properties closures and asset protection plan has been updated. We are operating at 60% availability rate statewide</p> <p>4. Spill Response: GREEN Fully operational, maintaining situational awareness and readiness.</p> <p>5. Parks Services: YELLOW</p> <p>Continuing to make improvements on closures in the southern half of the state where needed based on visitor use from this past weekend. Staff in cooperation with BLE are providing presence at several properties for asset protection.</p> <p>DNR RESOURCES ASSIGNED TO COVID-19 for April 13.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • DNR staff on IMT: 23 • DNR SEOC (remote): 2 • DNR assisting DHS: 13 <p>*Law Enforcement personnel have 50 wardens assigned to Security in the Parks that are closed.</p>
Alternative Care Facilities	<p>The ACF task force group continues to plan with local partners to establish an alternative care facility in Milwaukee County. Gilbane has been identified as the contractor as well as several other local sub-contractors.</p> <p>Additional guidance on planning considerations for establishing an ACF will be released from the SEOC in the next couple of days. This document complements Surge guidance and planning efforts which need to be fully explored prior to planning for an ACF.</p>

DOC	<p>DOC continues to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • examine current and future resource needs and request through the appropriate channels. • future plan for potential releases of COVID positive or symptomatic individuals from jail or prison facilities. • monitor inmate and staff confirmed cases to plan for staffing, surge, and other needs as appropriate. • collaborate with DHS and other agencies on best practices in a variety of DOC settings.
WSP	<p>State Patrol continues to support the SNS warehouse security mission. State Patrol is available to assist in the courier transport of COVID-19 samples to an identified laboratory for testing and critical medical supplies to and from the SNS warehouse. State Patrol dispatch centers continue to field questions from the public related to the “Safer at Home” order. Our social media outlets continue the “Safer at Home” messaging and FAQs provided by WEM/DHS and Governor's Office PIOs.</p>
Mortuary Affairs	<p>We want to remind everyone that the goal of the Mortuary Affairs Task force is to assist local/ county/ and tribal partners where there is a need. The Task Force’s number one priority to ensure we are respectfully and safely handling remains and where our partners have the need we want to support their need to accomplish that too.</p> <p>The Mortuary Affairs Support and Assistance Team (MASAT) update. The team is intended to operate in support of and not replacing Coroners and Medical Examiners. We will assist with some areas of the C/ME operation such as lifting moving and transporting remains in a safe and respectful manner.</p> <p>Coroners and Medical Examiners are encouraged to continue to work closely with their County and Tribal Emergency Management partners and Funeral Directors for determining specific bodybag usage and needs.</p> <p>Request for resources should go through County/ Tribal Emergency Management to the SEOC.</p> <p>Please share the DHS PPE conservation guidance with stakeholder during coordination. https://www.dhs.wisconsin.gov/covid-19/ppe.htm</p> <p>Coroners and Medical Examiners are encouraged to continue to complete the survey daily to allow us to understand the status of the system and make informed decisions.</p>

Current Incident Objectives and Planning Activities

Isolation Facilities

- Operate isolation facilities in Madison and Milwaukee for 30 days and develop a transition plan for local operations.

Specimen Collection & Lab Capacity

- Engage public/private partnership to stand up alternate lab capacity at one location.
- Work with private and public sector partners to secure reagent supply.

Essential Workforce Child Care

- Stand up and maintain system to meet essential worker childcare needs.

Surge

- Support the local execution 1200-bed capacity in Milwaukee and 500-bed surge capacity in Madison to meet the demand of underserved populations.
- Assess and support local surge needs in other areas of the state, including rural areas.

Data Analytics

- Support the data analysis needs of the SEOC taskforces and develop a daily reporting strategy.

Contact Tracing / Surveillance

- Identify areas of highest need for contract tracing and deploy staff as necessary.

Logistics

- Establish facilities, technology, processes, and staffing to integrate acquisition, warehousing, and distribution of PPE and other essential supplies.

Future Ops

- Develop a plan to build community resilience in within 6 key sectors, including vulnerable populations, rural healthcare, and long-term care.
- Develop recommendations for potential long-term impacts, including behavioral and social changes, supply chain, and secondary or cascading threats.

Staff Augmentation

- Establish a database and process to match staffing needs to available resources.

Community Resilience

- Develop a plan to create community resilience in 6 key factors, including vulnerable populations, incarcerated populations, rural healthcare and long-term care.

Mortuary Affairs

- Develop plans for centralize decedent surge storage site(s).

State Emergency Operations Center (SEOC)

- Roll out SEOC staff surge team training by April 13.

- Complete third round of non-medical PPE distribution by April 15.
- Implement integrated Post SNS PPE allocation strategy by April 20.

Weather (Updated 4/13/2020 – 2:30 PM)

Quiet work week expected overall. Strong northwest winds will frequently gust to 30 to 40 mph with gusts to 45 mph over eastern and most of southern Wisconsin. Wind Advisory for southern and portions of northeast Wisconsin through 7 PM. A Lakeshore Flood Advisory remains in effect for Brown, Door and Kewaunee Counties today. Gusty northwest winds will cause water to pile up on the bayshore areas of these counties. This will lead to a threat for lakeshore flooding in these areas.

Space Weather: No impacts expected for GPS/radio communications.

Aviation Weather: VFR ceilings across mainly northern and eastern WI into this evening. A few rain or snow showers Tuesday, with ceilings expected to remain VFR.

River Flooding (Updated 4/13/2020 – 2:30 PM)

Ongoing Minor flooding: Portions of the Mississippi River, and the Wolf River at Shiocton. Several rivers may rise into minor flood stage over the next several days due to the weekend rain and melting snow.
