## Governor Evers press releases and media briefings related to statewide mandates:

### April 20, 2020

- Gov. Tony Evers today announced that the state of Wisconsin is taking big steps to increase COVID-19 testing capacity throughout the state. Working with the Wisconsin Clinical Lab Network, the state has grown the number of labs performing COVID-19 tests from just eight labs one month ago to 36 labs as of today. The state plans to continue public-private partnerships to add more labs and more testing capacity in the days and weeks ahead. However, in order to sustain the existing and expanded clinical lab network's efforts, the state will need federal partnership to ensure availability of reagent and other critical supplies in Wisconsin.
- Gov. Tony Evers today announced Wisconsin's "Badger Bounce Back" plan which outlines important criteria for Wisconsin to be able to reopen its economy in phases and includes steps to make sure workers and businesses are prepared to reopen as soon as it is safe to do so. In coordination with this announcement, at the direction of the governor, Wisconsin Department of Health Services Secretary-designee Andrea Palm issued Emergency Order #31 establishing the process and outlining the phases of the plan.

This change was made to reflect an interim COVID-19 position statement issued by the Council for State and Territorial Epidemiologists on April 5, 2020. The position statement included a case definition and made COVID-19 a nationally notifiable disease.*

*\*\* A confirmed case or death is defined by meeting confirmatory laboratory evidence for COVID-19. A probable case or death is defined by i) meeting clinical criteria AND epidemiologic evidence with no confirmatory laboratory testing performed for COVID-19; or ii) meeting presumptive laboratory evidence AND either clinical criteria OR epidemiologic evidence; or iii) meeting vital records criteria with no confirmatory laboratory testing performed for COVID-19. State and local public health departments are now testing and publicly reporting their cases. In the event of a discrepancy between CDC cases and cases reported by state and local public health officials, data reported by states should be considered the most up to date.*

## **Unmet Needs**

The current unmet needs are being routed through Operations and some identified unmet needs have fallen to task forces, which include Isolation Facilities, Contact Tracing/Surveillance, Specimen Collection/Lab Capacity, Surge, Mortuary Planning, Data Analysis, Community Resilience, PPE & Essential Supplies, Logistics, Future Operations, and Staff Augmentation.

## **State Agency Response Overview**

**DHS** DHS warehouse staff worked with SEOC logistics and additional warehouse staff to begin the merge into a comprehensive warehouse approach featuring one set of staff and one inventory system. This merge process will continue throughout the rest of the week.

DHS staff worked with the HERC coordinators to navigate communication with healthcare agencies about their ability to support decontamination of PPE for additional agencies.

DHS has been developing the rollout process for the long-term strategy for PPE distribution to healthcare agencies and EMS. This strategy was developed by the SEOC and will be in effect next week. The information will be shared through webinars, GovDelivery, and other communications channels.

Meat Safety Inspection During COVID-19 Pandemic - 04/20/2020:

The State of Wisconsin Bureau of Meat and Poultry Businesses (WBMPB) is currently following the Department of Health Services (WDHS) guidance to minimize exposure to the virus that causes COVID-19.

Meat safety inspection staff follow the Sanitation Standard Operating Procedures (SSOPs) of the inspected establishments. Meat safety inspection staff are practicing social distancing, frequent handwashing, and are prohibited from working in establishments if they are infected or showing symptoms of illness. Slaughter facilities have the option of WBMPB staff

following alternate slaughter inspection procedures in order to provide for more social distancing between meat safety inspection staff and industry. Please discuss any inquiries for slaughter procedure changes with the assigned meat safety inspector or the assigned meat safety supervisor in the inspector's circuit.

Facemasks or coverings are currently not required for meat safety inspection staff but may be worn if they choose. If an establishment chooses to change their SSOPs to minimize exposure to hazards, please discuss these changes with the assigned meat safety inspection staff. We will do everything we can to accommodate any industry requests.

- DOC The DOC continues to:
- Produce face masks within DOC sites in order to provide for both staff and persons in our care
  - Monitor PPE needs and request through appropriate channels
  - Monitor positive cases within DOC institutions and staff and address as appropriate
  - Collaborate with DHS, an assistance Web Ex will be held on Thursday to answer questions regarding recent DHS guidance distributed to all DOC institutions and executive staff
- HC Worker Childcare 90% of cases for childcare requests are closed. Per 2019 Act 185, DCF is developing proposals to submit to JFC for \$51M of CCDBG CARES funding for childcare providers.
- WSP WSP continues to support the SNS warehouse security mission. WSP dispatch centers continue to answer questions from the public related to the "Safer at Home" order. WSP continues to assist (when requested) in providing courier transport for COVID-19 patient samples to the identified laboratory for testing and critical medical supplies to and from the SNS warehouse site.

## Current Incident Objectives and Planning Activities

### Isolation Facilities

- Operate isolation facilities in Madison and Milwaukee for 30 days and develop a transition plan for local operations.

### Specimen Collection & Lab Capacity

- Engage public/private partnership to stand up alternate lab capacity at one location.
- Work with private and public sector partners to secure reagent supply.

### Essential Workforce Child Care

- Stand up and maintain system to meet essential worker childcare needs.

### Surge

- Support the local execution 1200-bed capacity in Milwaukee and 500-bed surge capacity in Madison to meet the demand of underserved populations.
- Assess and support local surge needs in other areas of the state, including rural areas.

### Data Analytics

- Support the data analysis needs of the SEOC taskforces and develop a daily reporting strategy.

### Contact Tracing / Surveillance

- Identify areas of highest need for contract tracing and deploy staff as necessary.

## Logistics

- Establish facilities, technology, processes, and staffing to integrate acquisition, warehousing, and distribution of PPE and other essential supplies.

## Future Ops

- Develop a plan to build community resilience in within 6 key sectors, including vulnerable populations, rural healthcare, and long-term care.
- Develop recommendations for potential long-term impacts, including behavioral and social changes, supply chain, and secondary or cascading threats.

## Staff Augmentation

- Establish a database and process to match staffing needs to available resources.

## Community Resilience

- Develop a plan to create community resilience in 6 key factors, including vulnerable populations, incarcerated populations, rural healthcare and long-term care.

## Mortuary Affairs

- Develop plans for centralize decedent surge storage site(s).

## State Emergency Operations Center (SEOC)

- Roll out SEOC staff surge team training by April 22.
- Implement integrated post-SNS PPE allocation strategy by April 21.
- Develop guidance for new PPE distribution starting April 21.


