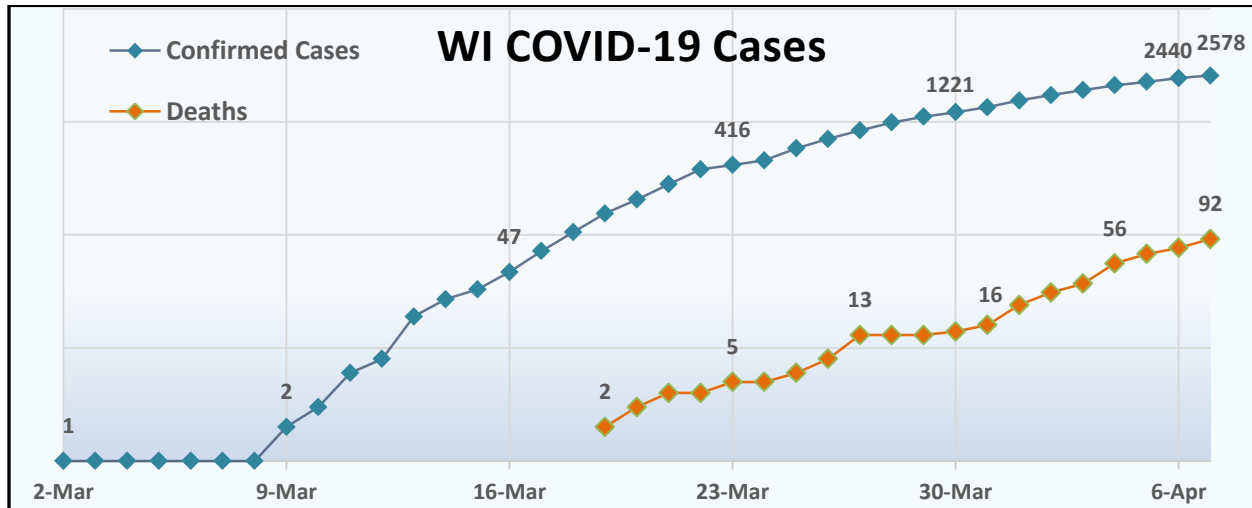

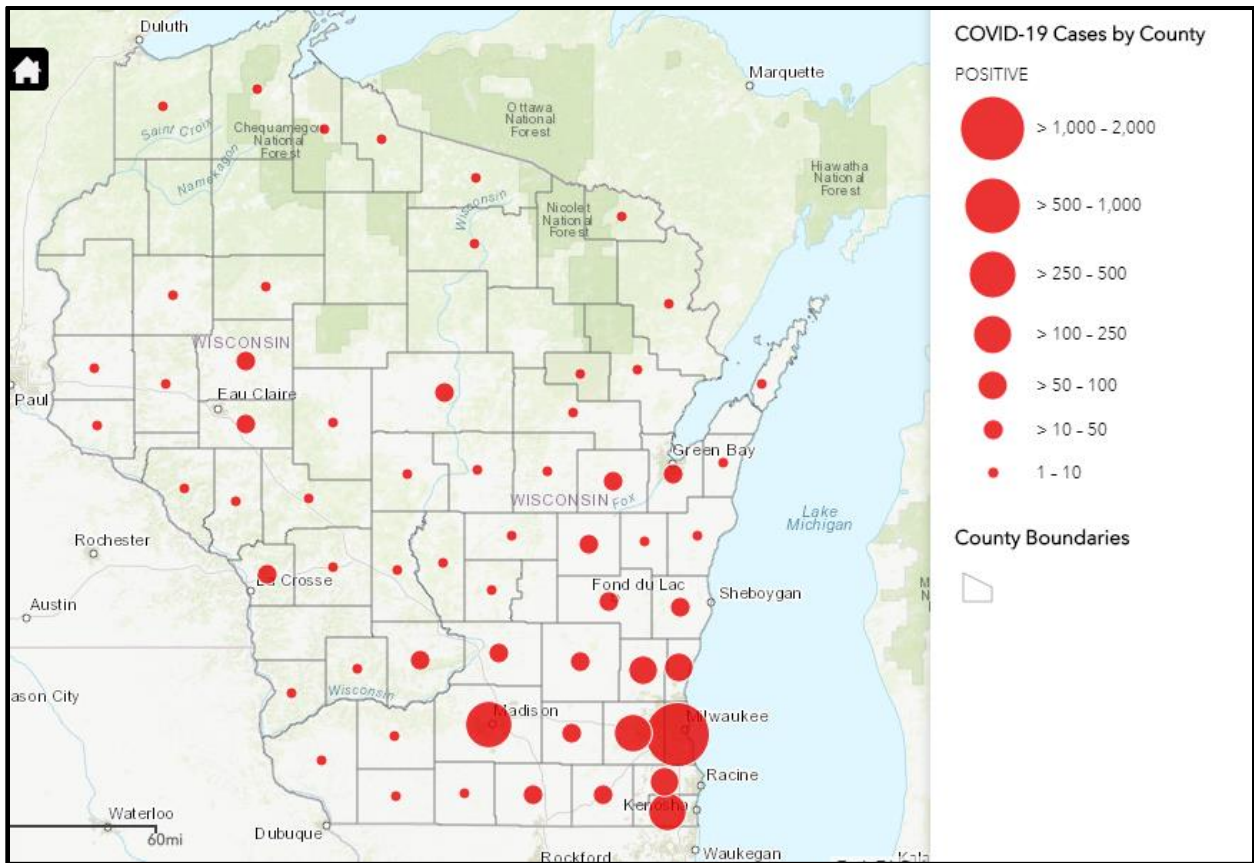

(U) Highlights

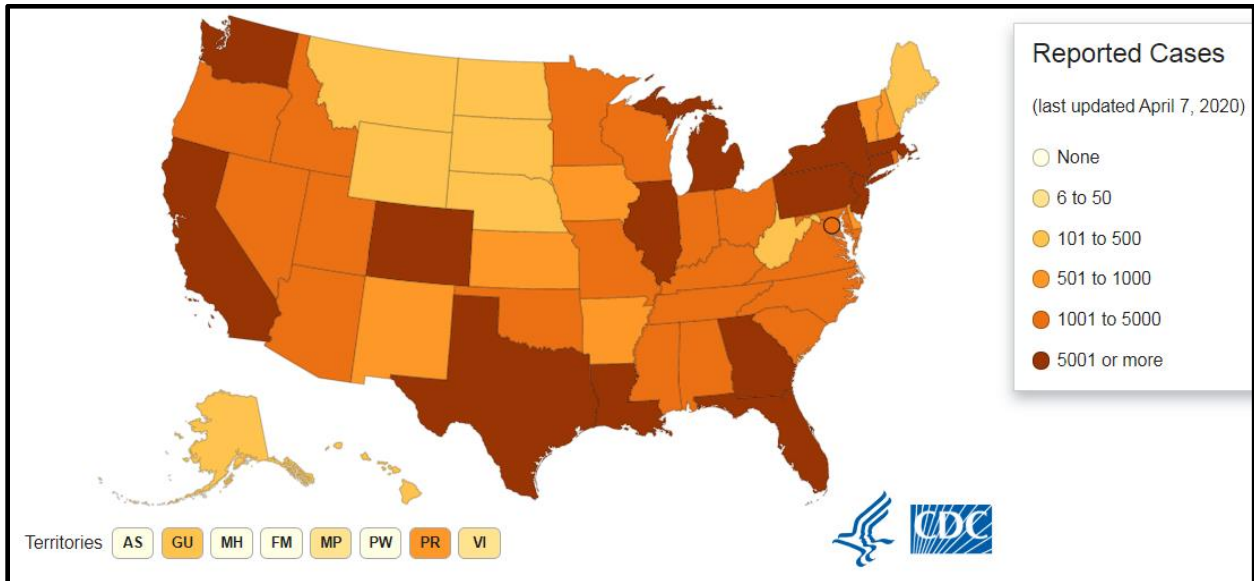
- (U) The Waukesha County Jail [confirmed](#) that a 41-year old male inmate is their first positive case of COVID-19. **[TMJ4]**
- (U) The Wisconsin Department of Health Services (WI-DHS) announced the state has the [ability to test](#) 35,000 people a day. **[TMJ4]**
- (U) UW-Health in Madison joined a group of [nationwide clinical trials](#) that will begin treating the most severe COVID-19 patients with blood plasma from recovered COVID-19 patients. **[Milwaukee Journal Sentinel]**
- (U) The WI-DHS respiratory report from the week ending on 28 March showed the percent of [influenza positive lab tests fell](#) from over 15% to just over 4%. It is possible that social distancing for COVID-19 has also affected the number for positive flu tests. **[Milwaukee Journal Sentinel]**
- (U) As part of a first-in-the-nation random survey, the University of Miami School of Medicine will [begin using a screening tool](#) that uses blood antibodies to show if a person has been exposed to COVID-19. This will potentially allow researchers to show the percent of infected. **[CBS Miami]**
- (U) On 06 April, 3M and the Trump Administration [announced a plan](#) to import 166.5 million respirators over the next three months to support healthcare workers in the United States. The announcement noted that the plan would not pull from supplies heading to other nations. **[Business Wire]**
- (U) Countries in Europe that are at or near their peak of COVID-19 cases have begun [drafting plans to reopen](#). Austria, Denmark, and Germany have all issued plans to slowly begin reopening in the come weeks if the infection rate stays sufficiently low. **[Daily Mail]**
- (U) U.K. Prime Minister Boris Johnson [was moved to an intensive care unit](#) and is currently receiving oxygen, but is not on a ventilator at this time. **[BBC]**
- (U) China [reported](#) zero new COVID-19 deaths for the first time since January. However, in Wuhan dozens of residential blocks were locked down one day before travel restrictions were set to be lifted due to new outbreaks. **[The Guardian]**

(U) Associated Threats & Mitigations

- (U) Under the Defense Production Act, suppliers may be required to prioritize federal PPE orders. Regional agencies requiring PPE may have orders canceled or need to contact alternative suppliers in order to get the required equipment. **[Wisconsin Healthcare Facility]**
- (U) The Better Business Bureau is [warning people](#) working from home during COVID-19 to be aware of two prominent frauds. One occurs when bad actors use emails similar to your company or suppliers and get people to click on links. The second occurs when people try to get others to spend money to take care of an IT issue or use the issue to gain remote access to someone's computer. **[TMJ4]**
