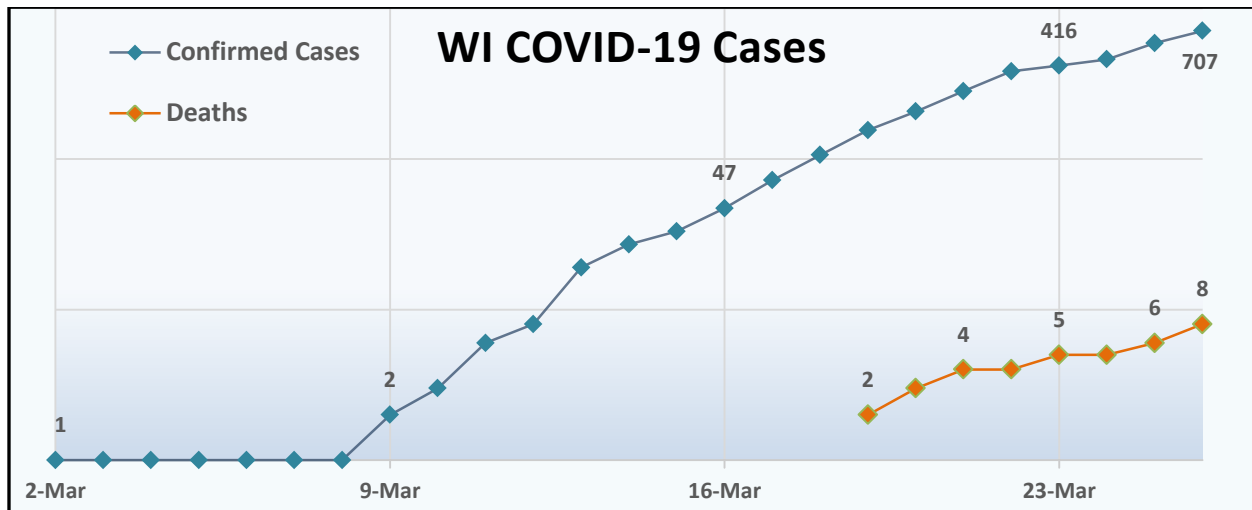

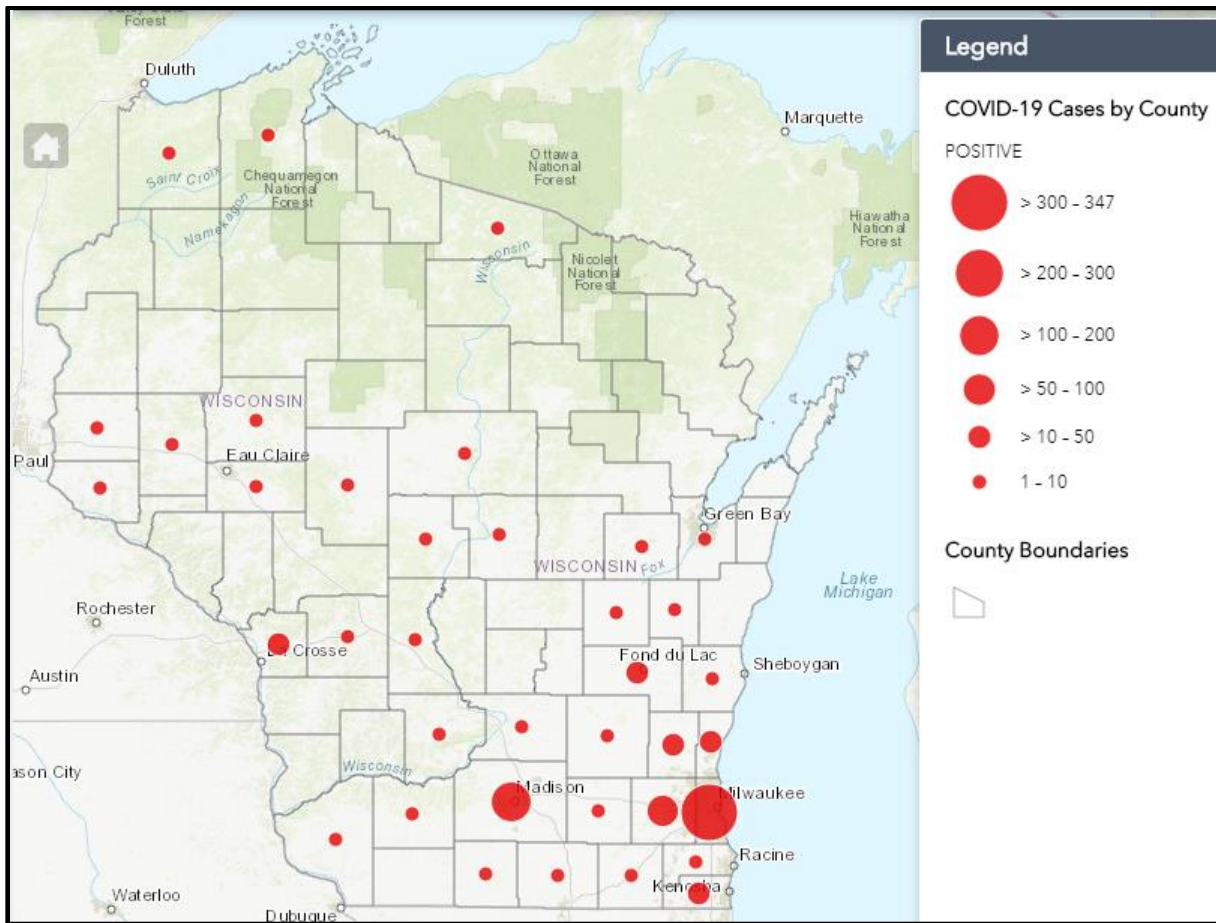
(U) Highlights

- (U) Milwaukee Public Schools [announced](#) in a letter to families, that all MPS schools would remain closed until further notice. **[Milwaukee Public Schools]**
- (U) Port Milwaukee representatives [announced](#) that both commercial activities and Public Port facilities remain open. They are following social distancing and other guidance where appropriate. **[Port Milwaukee]**
- (U) The Governor of Wisconsin [closed the state capital building](#) in Madison indefinitely, though the Department of Administration said it would open the building if the state Legislature or the state Supreme Court decides to convene. Neither body has announced any plans to convene at this time. **[NBC26]**
- (U) Around 3.3 million [people filed a claim](#) for jobless aid in the week ending March 21. That is almost five times the worst single week after the crash of 2008, when claims rose to 665,000. **[CBS News]**
- (U) On 25 March, the US Secretary of Defense enacted a [60-day stop movement order](#) for all Department of Defense uniformed and civilian personnel and their sponsored family members overseas. **[Department of Defense]**
- (U) Individuals who intentionally spread the novel coronavirus could be [charged with terrorism](#) for the “purposeful exposure and infection of others,” according to a Justice Department memo. **[Politico]**
- (U) Honeywell is [increasing the production](#) of N95 masks in its Smithfield, Rhode Island facility. The company said the new production line will create at least 500 jobs and it will start to recruit, hire, and train new employees immediately. **[Fox Business]**
- (U) DuPont, the biotech company, is [expediting the production](#) and delivery of Tyvek hazmat suits. The suits provide full-body protection against infectious organisms. **[NBC News]**

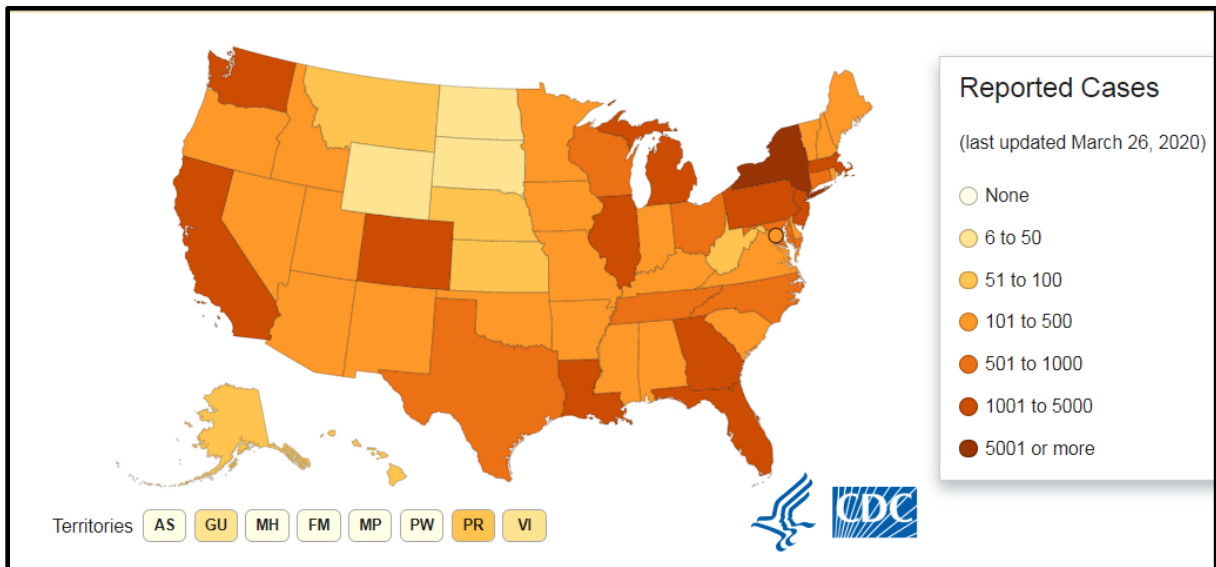
(U) Associated Threats & Mitigations

- (U) On 24 March following a long-running domestic terrorism investigation, [the FBI attempted](#) to arrest the suspect who was armed. The suspect was shot and later succumbed to his injuries. The suspect had planned to commit a bombing and because of the pandemic and, “decided to accelerate his plan” to use a vehicle bomb to attack a hospital. **[Washington Post]**
 - (U) Comment: STAC and WSIC remind our partners to remain vigilant, as others may perceive the pandemic as an opportunity to exploit the perceived lack of law enforcement resources.

- (U) Repurposing pharmaceuticals for COVID-19 treatment without a doctor’s direction may pose a significant health risk. An [Arizona man died](#) and his wife is in critical care after ingesting a toxic parasite treatment used in aquariums. The wife stated she noticed the ingredient “chloroquine phosphate” on the label and believed it to be the same drug used in malaria treatments and anecdotally used in COVID-19 treatments. **[NBC News]**
