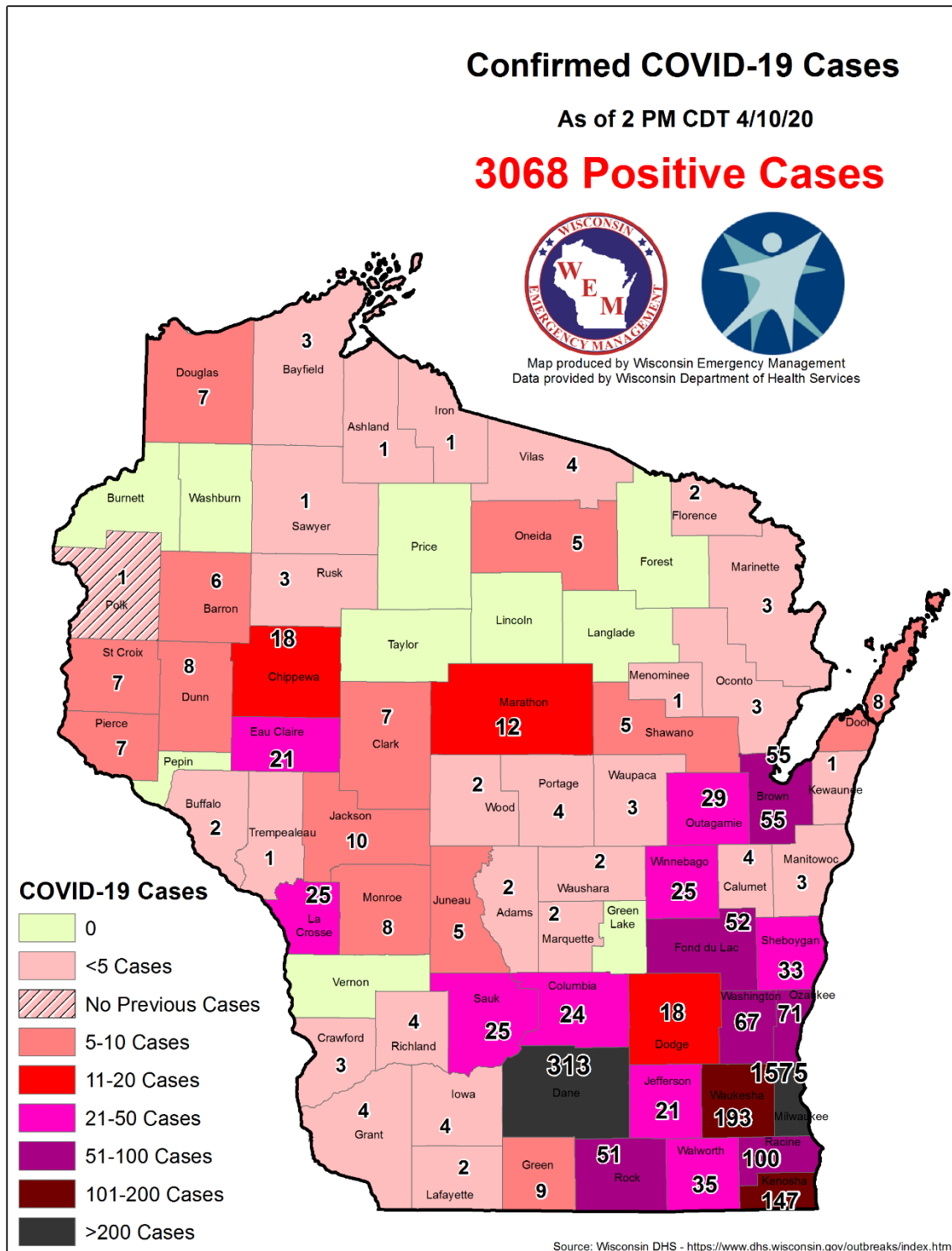


State of Wisconsin COVID-19 Response

10 APRIL – 0700-1900



Summary

The WI Hospitals Association (WHA) created a data dashboard related to daily COVID-19 hospitalizations and equipment capacity. Working closely with DHS, the data is compiled from information received by DHS. The dashboard shows information related to hospital admissions and bed count, available ventilators, and the number of hospitals with seven days or fewer supplies of PPE. At present only the following entities can request PPE from the SNS reserve utilizing the form submitted.

- Any entity licensed by DQA as a residential facility.
- All licensed or certified Adult Family Homes.
- Home Health, Personal Care and Supportive Home Care Providers caring for a COVID-19 positive patient in the patient’s home.
- Participant hired providers caring for a COVID-19 positive patient in the patient’s home (Applies to all Medicaid Long Term Care programs).
- Adult Protective Services providers responding to a home with a COVID-19 positive person in their home.

Unmet Needs

The current unmet needs are being routed through Operations and some identified unmet needs have fallen to task forces, which include Isolation Facilities, Contact Tracing/Surveillance, Specimen Collection/Lab Capacity, Surge, Mortuary Planning, Data Analysis, Community Resilience, PPE & Essential Supplies, Logistics, Future Operations, and Staff Augmentation.

State Agency Response Overview

DHS	<p>DHS collected information pertaining to the use of N95 decontamination by Wisconsin hospitals in order to inform the state's approach to preservation and sterilization of N95s.</p> <p>DHS staff have monitored a significant increase of over 300 new registrations in the Wisconsin Emergency Assistance Volunteer Registry following the Governor's announcement during the 1:30pm media briefing.</p> <p>The DHS Survey Team continued processing data from the third phase of the strategic national stockpile in order to determine allocations for eligible hospitals, EMS, and nursing facilities.</p> <p>DHS received over 10 requests for PPE from long term care agencies caring for a COVID-19 positive patient through the PPE reserve request form, and has begun processing them for allocation.</p> <p>With the assistance of the regional WEM operations associates, DHS provided information to all county emergency managers, local health officers, regional directors, and HERC coordinators regarding the quantities of PPE delivered to agencies in their county.</p>
DATCP	<p>DATCP issued Guidelines for Essential Agribusinesses during the Safer at Home Order which were released and provides guidance on u-pick activities to keep consumers safe on April 9, 2020.</p>
DOC	<p>DOC continues to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Collaborate with DHS, WING and others after completed site assistance visits at all DOC institutions, statewide. More specifically, working with DHS to develop guidance documents and support systems for DOC, based on information gathered from site visits.• Track current and future resource needs and staffing patterns.• Future plan and develop potential responses should staff or inmate cases increase.• Emphasize work from home options for those who can safely do so.
DNR	<p>Conservation Wardens have been deployed to State Park entrances to enforce the property closures.</p>
Community Resilience	<p>Task Force has identified goals and is forming membership.</p>
Isolation Facilities	<p>The Milwaukee and Madison facilities are operational as of April 1, 2020. Currently, the task force is focused on future plans to transition the facilities to local operations and updating the guidance for the facilities.</p>

Mortuary Affairs	The Mortuary Affairs Support and Assistance Team (MASAT) update. To support local storage efforts, we will be releasing some guidance soon. We are also developing plans for decedent storage sites that can be stood up if local storage efforts need to be augmented and the deployable storage resources don't meet local needs. We are encouraging everyone to continue to develop capacity locally and these sites shouldn't be the first solution, but a fall back option if needed
PPE and Essential Supplies	State Agency distribution status – all items were distributed to State Agencies today.
WSP	WSP continues to support the SNS warehouse security mission, as their dispatch centers continue to field questions from the public related to the “Safer at Home order.” Our social media continue to message the “Safer at Home” and continues to assist (when requested) in providing courier transport for COVID-19 patient samples to the identified laboratory for testing and critical medical supplies to and from the SNS site.

Current Incident Objectives and Planning Activities

Isolation Facilities

- Operate isolation facilities in Madison and Milwaukee for 30 days and develop a transition plan for local operations.

Specimen Collection & Lab Capacity

- Engage public/private partnership to stand up alternate lab capacity at one location.
- Work with private and public sector partners to secure reagent supply.

Essential Workforce Child Care

- Stand up and maintain system to meet essential worker childcare needs.

Surge

- Support the local execution 1200-bed capacity in Milwaukee and 500-bed surge capacity in Madison to meet the demand of underserved populations.
- Assess and support local surge needs in other areas of the state, including rural areas.

Data Analytics

- Support the data analysis needs of the SEOC taskforces and develop a daily reporting strategy.

Contact Tracing / Surveillance

- Identify areas of highest need for contract tracing and deploy staff as necessary.

Logistics

- Establish facilities, technology, processes, and staffing to integrate acquisition, warehousing, and distribution of PPE and other essential supplies.

Future Ops

- Develop a plan to build community resilience in within 6 key sectors, including vulnerable populations, rural healthcare, and long-term care.
- Develop recommendations for potential long-term impacts, including behavioral and social changes, supply chain, and secondary or cascading threats.

Staff Augmentation

- Establish a database and process to match staffing needs to available resources.

Community Resilience

- Develop a plan to create community resilience in 6 key factors, including vulnerable populations, incarcerated populations, rural healthcare and long-term care.

Mortuary Affairs

- Develop plans for centralize decedent surge storage site(s) by April 9.

State Emergency Operations Center (SEOC)

- Support completion of a draft LTC outbreak triage process by April 11.
- Roll out SEOC staff surge team training by April 13.
- Complete third round of non-medical PPE distribution by April 15.
- Implement integrated Post SNS PPE allocation strategy by April 20.

Weather

Lighter winds and dry conditions are expected today and tonight. NWS is watching an accumulating snow and strong wind potential for Wisconsin Sunday afternoon into Monday. There are better chances for accumulating snow from western to northern Wisconsin at this time, but still uncertain with exact amounts and wind speeds. Gusty winds are expected to linger Monday night into Tuesday.

Space Weather: No impacts expected for GPS/radio communications.

Aviation Weather: VFR ceilings and visibility values are expected across the state today and tonight

River Flooding

Minor flooding: Portions of the Mississippi River, and the Wolf River at Shiocton

Rain Saturday night into Sunday may cause some rivers to rise by early next week, mainly over southern Wisconsin.
