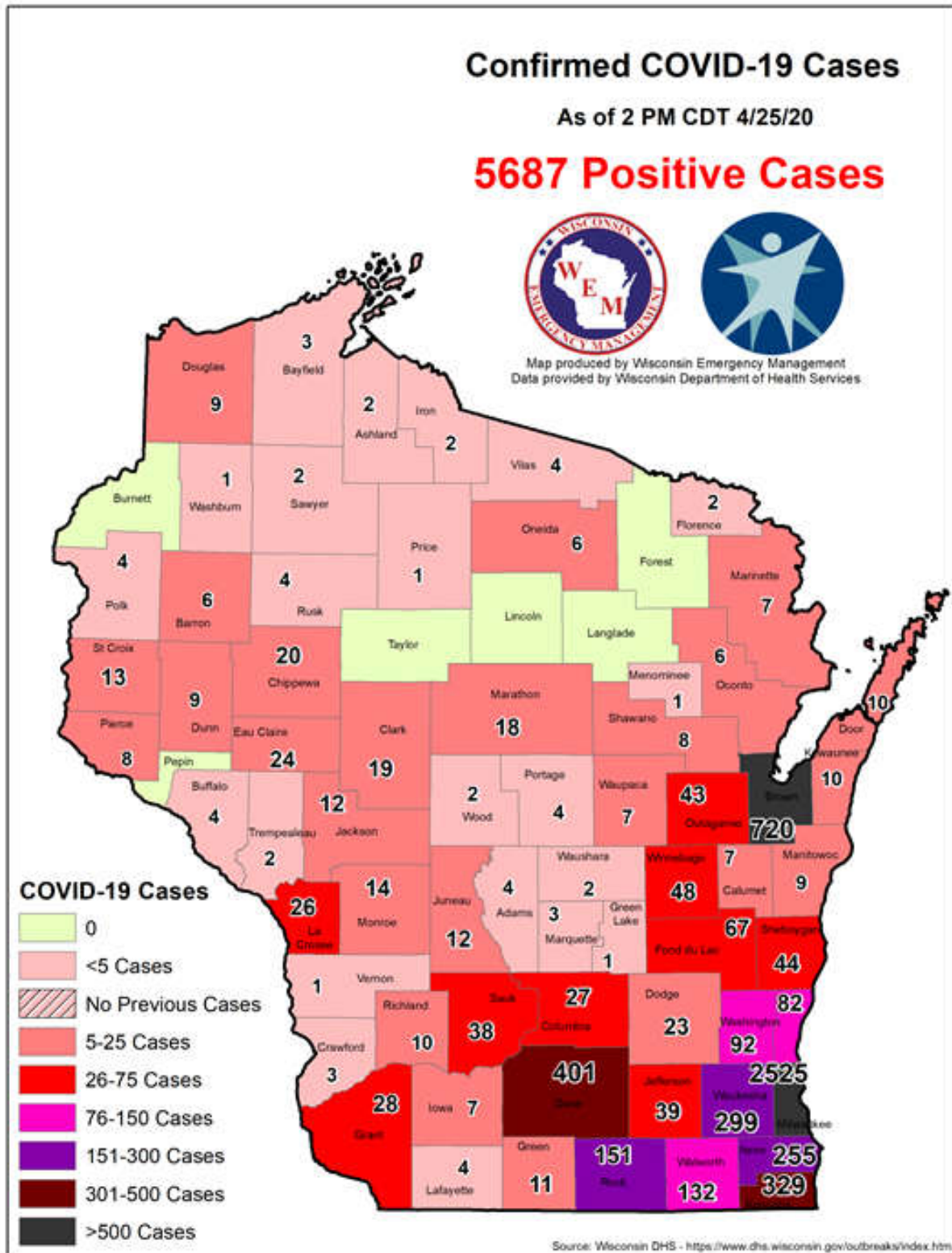


# State of Wisconsin COVID-19 Response

Situation to Date  
25 APRIL – 0700-1900



## Summary

The county/tribe PPE survey is now available, and responses are due by 6pm on Monday, April 27. The survey is to capture all county/tribal needs for both medical and non-medical PPE requests. A delivery location must be provided as shipments will be going directly to the county/tribe. Counties/tribes will then determine how the supplies received are allocated locally. Weekly, counties/tribes will be required to submit a report that details how distribution is made. Additionally, for federal cost reporting counties/tribes are required to track PPE type, quantity, date distributed, and recipient agency name, address, and city: <https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/9Z6J3SR>.

- April 27 survey due by 6pm.
- April 28 SEOC determines allocations.
- April 29 SEOC warehouse processes allocations. Ops shares allocation amounts.
- April 30 distribution begins .
  - Counties/Tribes - direct delivery
  - State agencies - warehouse pick-up

The SEOC remains elevated to a Level 1 activation and continues with 24-hour operations.

## Current Incident Objectives and Planning Activities

- Complete roll-out of SEOC staff surge team position-specific training for operations, planning, and logistics by April 27.
- Establish a weekly rhythm in coordination with the supply team on the allocation of PPE to counties/tribes and state agencies by April 27.
- Provide a recommendation to the policy group on non-SNS PPE reserve needs by April 25.
- Submit to FEMA the request for Milwaukee HOC and Dane County ACFs upon decision by the Policy Group.

+ Numbers updated Saturday and Sunday are not confirmed by state and territorial health departments. These numbers will be modified when numbers are updated on Monday. CDC does not know the exact number of COVID-19 illnesses, hospitalizations, and deaths for a variety of reasons. COVID-19 can cause mild illness, symptoms might not appear immediately, there are delays in reporting and testing, not everyone who is infected gets tested or seeks medical care, and there may be differences in how states and territories confirm numbers in their jurisdictions

## Unmet Needs

The current unmet needs are being routed through Operations and some identified unmet needs have fallen to task forces, which include Isolation Facilities, Contact Tracing/Surveillance, Specimen Collection/Lab Capacity, Surge, Mortuary Planning, Data Analysis, Community Resilience, PPE & Essential Supplies, Logistics, Future Operations, and Staff Augmentation.

## State Agency Response Overview

DNR

1. Wildfire Suppression: GREEN: Current and projected fire staffing requirements for the next few days can be met. DNR Suppression capability is diminished as a result of COVID with numerous staff having limited availability. The fire danger today ranges from Moderate to High and statewide fire preparedness level remains at PL-2. With fair weather this weekend, there is likely to be an increase in outdoor activity and human-caused fires. Four Single Engine Air Tankers (SEATs) are active today to assist with fire suppression in our most hazardous landscapes.
2. Flood Response: GREEN: Flood response staffing is at full capacity, including backup staff. There are no known illnesses or absences among responders. All individuals are currently available to deploy as needed. Conditions remain "static." Continuing to monitor flood conditions and forecasts; forecast generally appears quiet for Saturday and Sunday, and rain/storm chances will increase next week. Few rivers remain in flood stage.
3. Law Enforcement/Asset Protection: YELLOW: BLE has all 50 wardens in SER and SCR

tied up and on assignment managing Park Closures. Additionally, BLE has several wardens stationed at NER at High Cliff of which are unavailable for the same closure needs. If necessary, to effectuate response to flooding, fire etc., BLE can withdraw some or all of its LE resources (SER, SCR and High Cliff) for reassignment to an immediate life safety issue per our Asset Protection Plan.

4. Spill Response: GREEN: Spills Team is fully operational, maintaining situational awareness and readiness. There are no known illnesses or absences among the team at this time. All individuals are currently available to respond as needed.

5. Parks Services: GREEN: Program continues to have properties open in the north and closures in the south. Staff in cooperation with BLE are providing presence at several properties for asset protection.
